Entry fees must be paid in US funds.

All entries must be submitted on official AKC entry forms, one dog per entry form. Photocopies of entry forms without the AKC Agreement are not acceptable. Unsigned, incomplete, or illegible entries are not acceptable.

The Agility Course Test (ACT) is an entry level agility event to introduce beginning dogs and handlers to the sport of agility and the AKC agility program. There are two levels of ACT events:

1. ACT1 (Standard)/ACT1J (Jumpers): designed for the beginning level dog to show beginning sequencing and performance skills.
2. ACT2 (Standard)/ACT2J (Jumpers): requires an increased skill level shown by the additional obstacles to be performed.

Notice to Exhibitors

Dogs Eligible to Enter

- All dogs fifteen (15) months of age or older may enter a test.
- Dogs must be physically sound as described in Chapter 1, Section 3, Paragraph 7 of the *Regulations for Agility Trials*.
- In order to acquire the title certificate and have the title added to a dog's record, the dog must be registered/listed with the AKC.
- Canine Partner applications may be accepted at the test by the judge/evaluator and submitted with test results.
- Dogs that are not AKC registered/listed may participate and their performance will be recorded by the AKC under a temporary recording number. This temporary recording number will be e-mailed to the owner and must be used when entering subsequent ACT events and when the owner registers/lists the dog. **Note:** Temporary recording numbers may only be used to enter ACT events.

Jump Height Divisions

- Dogs may be entered at any of the following jump height divisions at the owner's discretion:
 - 4, 8, 12, 16, 20 or 24 inches
- There is no Regular or Preferred distinction in the ACT program.
- A jump height card is not required to enter an ACT event.

3. ACT 1 Round 1
4. ACT 1 Round 2
5. ACT 2 Round 1
6. ACT 2 Round 2
7. ACT Jumpers 2 Round 1
8. ACT Jumpers 2 Round 2

- The safety of the dogs is our primary concern. By entering these trials, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all exercises safely.
- Entry fees will not be refunded if the trials cannot be opened or completed by reason of riots, civil disturbance, fire, an act of God, public emergency, an act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee.
- Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by action of the Event Committee.
- Since bitches in season are not allowed to compete in AKC Obedience or Rally Trials, the club will refund all but \$5.00 of the entry fee per day for bitches unable to compete for that reason. The Trial Secretary must receive written notification from a veterinarian of such a claim for refund by letter hand-delivered, emailed, or postmarked before the trial commences.
- No refunds other than bitches in season will be offered.
- It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the Event Committee, be asked to leave the trial site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. Exhibitors are responsible for being ready for judging when called to the ring. The judge need not wait for any dog holding up a class. The Show-Giving Club and Show Secretary have no obligation or responsibility for providing service through a public address system, or stewards or runners for the purpose of locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required.
- Entries must be made on Official AKC entry forms or copies and must include the signed Agreement and Rules. Junior Handlers must complete back of form.
- All owners of mixed breed dogs must first obtain an AKC Canine Partners listing number before they may enter an AKC event. The dog's breed name should be entered as "All American Dog".
- The dog's listing number must be entered on the entry form and "AKC No." checked.

Notice to Exhibitors Continued

- Exhibitors should follow their veterinarians' recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites and any communicable diseases and have appropriate vaccinations.
- Owners are responsible for errors in making out entry forms, whoever may have made such errors. No entry will be refunded in the event of such errors or cancellation of entries after the published closing date. Errors in entries made by the exhibitor cannot be corrected after the closing date.
- Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry fee. There is a \$25 returned check fee.
- All dogs must be on leash or crated at all times except when in the ring. Warm-up must be done on lead.
- Dogs **MUST** be 15 months or older
- Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dog(s) at the show site and at all hotels, motels, and campgrounds where they are staying while competing in these trials.
- **COLLARS:** At the handler's option, dogs may run a course with or without a collar. The only collars allowed when running a course are flat buckle or rolled leather collars, but there shall be no attachments hanging or otherwise allowed on the collar. This shall not preclude painted or stitched designs or information on the collar. Dog's names and/or identifying information may appear on the collar. No title, awards, or advertising may appear on the collar. Dogs may be brought to the start line on slip leads, choke chains, body harnesses, head halters or other collars that are permitted on the trial grounds. Pinch/prong and electrical collars (dummy or not), and special training collars are not allowed anywhere on the trial grounds.
- The building will not be available for setup prior to the trial. Trial hours are 1:00 pm – 5:00 pm CST.
- No smoking is allowed in the building.
- **CRATING:** Limited crating available in the building unless state guidelines dictate otherwise.
- Stone City Kennel Club will not be providing snacks. Please plan for your dietary needs including bringing water for your dogs.
- Free Parking and Admission are provided.

AKC Code of Sportsmanship

PREFACE: The sport of purebred dog competitive events dates prior to 1884, the year of AKC's birth. Shared values of those involved in the sport include principles of sportsmanship. They are practiced in all sectors of our sport: conformation, performance and companion. Many believe that these principles of sportsmanship are the prime reason why our sport has thrived for over one hundred years. With the belief that it is useful to periodically articulate the fundamentals of our sport, this code is presented.

- Sportsmen respect the history, traditions and integrity of the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen commit themselves to values of fair play, honesty, courtesy, and vigorous competition, as well as winning and losing with grace.
- Sportsmen refuse to compromise their commitment and obligation to the sport of purebred dogs by injecting personal advantage or consideration into their decisions or behavior.
- The sportsman judge judges only on the merits of the dogs and considers no other factors.
- The sportsman judge or exhibitor accepts constructive criticism.
- The sportsman exhibitor declines to enter or exhibit under a judge where it might reasonably appear that the judge's placements could be based on something other than the merits of the dogs.
- The sportsman exhibitor refuses to compromise the impartiality of a judge.
- The sportsman respects the AKC bylaws, rules, regulations and policies governing the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen find that vigorous competition and civility are not inconsistent and are able to appreciate the merit of their competition and the effort of competitors.
- Sportsmen welcome, encourage and support newcomers to the sport.
- Sportsmen will deal fairly with all those who trade with them.
- Sportsmen are willing to share honest and open appraisals of both the strengths and weaknesses of their breeding stock.
- Sportsmen spurn any opportunity to take personal advantage of positions offered or bestowed upon them.
- Sportsmen always consider as paramount the welfare of their dog.
- Sportsmen refuse to embarrass the sport, the American Kennel Club, or themselves while taking part in the sport.

INSTRUCTIONS

Dogs may be entered in any jump height. There is no Regular or Preferred distinction at AKC's ACT events.

In order to acquire the ACT1 or ACT2 title certificate and have the title added to a dog's record, the dog must be registered/listed with the American Kennel Club. AKC Canine PartnersSM applications may be accepted at the event and submitted to AKC with the event's results.

Dogs that are not AKC registered/listed may be registered at a later date and receive their ACT title at that time.

Dogs listed in the AKC Canine PartnersSM program should be listed as All American Dog and must include their AKC number on the entry form and check the AKC No. box.

Junior Handlers should enter their Junior Handler Number on the front of this form. Should you not have your Junior Handler number, it may be obtained from the American Kennel Club (919) 233-9767. If the Junior Handler is not the owner of the dog identified on the face of this form, what is the relationship of the Junior Handler to the Owner?
